

Consent for Boarding Diabetic Patients

Diabetic pets require more careful monitoring than typical boarders do, and we presume that is why you have brought your pet to stay with us at Broad River Animal Hospital.

When a diabetic pet is boarding, the response to insulin may be significantly different from that at home. Your pet's appetite may decrease. Kenneling and separation from you can be stressful for a pet. These changes may cause your pet's insulin requirement to vary from its normal standard. If your pet is boarding for more than a few days, a veterinarian will evaluate how your pet is doing and may decide to check blood glucose levels and adjust its insulin dose. This allows us to provide the best medical care and safest boarding environment for your diabetic pet.

In addition to boarding costs, we charge a nursing fee of \$11.25 per day and \$3.20 for biohazard waste disposal (syringes) daily. In turn, you can be assured that your pet will receive the correct insulin dosage at the appropriate time. Your pet will be boarded where a veterinarian can monitor on a regular basis. Changes in your pet's condition while boarding may incur an examination or blood sugar monitoring charges.

If your pet should require more intensive monitoring, we will make every effort to contact you.
